## **Sessions and Readings**

<u>Session One</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 66: 10 -12. Aims of the course and some clarification. The sanctity of family life in Islam. Many prophets received support of family members in carrying out their missionary work. Family respect and love as found in Hadîth al-Kisâ'. Spiritual aspect of a family life.

<u>Session Two</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 30:20 - 22. Marriage I - Islamic view of Marriage. Qur'ânin âyât and Hadîth on marriage. The goals and aims of marriage. Basic rules regarding marriage and Nikâh.

Session Three: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 24: 32 - 33. Marriage –II. Choosing a spouse. Present day obstacles to marriage. Rights of husbands and wives. Divorce and its effects.

<u>Session Four</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 16:90 -91. Rights of close relatives and the extended family. Relations with the in-laws.

<u>Session Five</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 24: 21 - 22. Family Ethics - Positive virtues in family relationships: love, forgiveness, good communication, mutual trust, give & take, etc.

<u>Session Six</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 36: 77 - 83. Conflict Resolution – find ways to avoid bitterness even in serious disagreements. Dealing with anger, jealousy, stubbornness, lethargy etc. Arguing reasonably.

<u>Session Seven</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 18: 45 -46. Material Issues in the family. Love for materialism not worth the arguments between the families. How much should a husband earn? What should be economic contribution of a wife?

<u>Session Eight</u>: Recitation from the Qur'ân with brief explanation of âyât 31: 17 -19. Raising of children – Rights of children in Islam. Countering the influence of Western environment. Raising good Muslim children.
