Spiritual traits constitute the soul's primary character and intentions, to which actions are subservient, make up its secondary character.

Defining the Spiritual Journey

- A quest for God.
- A movement from the outward to the inward.
- To polish the soul so it can reflect the image of God.

[Spiritual Practices are] a reminder of the eternal covenant made between God and man by virtue of which man remains in quest of the Divinity as long as he remains truly human. The man who remembers this pact and his own true identity remains ever faithful to his nature, hence faithful to his quest for the Divinity, for that Divinity which is already present at the centre of his being.

Precisely because it is a message of the eternal to what is permanent and abiding within man, Sufism, like other authentic spiritual ways, is perennial and remains engraved in the very texture of the human soul. Certainly there is a reality of every truth and a servant cannot reach the reality of Ikhlas unless he doesn't like people to praise him for the actions he has done for the sake of God.
