
# ALI 665: Quranic Arabic, Level 1, Session 4 (Oct 17, 2023)

#### Tuesdays Sep 26 to Nov 28, 2023, at Jaffari Community Centre

**Description**: Quranic Arabic helps Muslims understand the language of the Quran. In this course, we will learn simple Quranic vocabulary and grammar. Students will need to put in an average of three hours a week to work on the course. In this semester, we will identify nouns and their different forms, a few verbs, and particles from the oft recited Quranic Sūras. We will us Qur'anic Language Made Easy by Hafiza Iffath Hasan as the main text. During the class, we will often refer to The Qur'an: With a Phrase-by-Phrase English Translation by Ali Quli Qarai Occasionally we may take passages from *Access to Our'anic Arabic* by AbdulWahid Hamid.

#### Translation of the Du'ā before the class

In the name of Allah, the All-beneficent, the All-merciful. O Allah, bless Muhammad and the family of Muhammad. O Allah, grant us success in (thinking, saying and doing) that which You love and are pleased with. And never leave us to ourselves for the blink of an eye.

O Allah: remove from us the darkness of doubt (and error) and favor us with the light of understanding. O Allah: open for us the doors of Your mercy and unfold for us the treasures of Your knowledge. O Allah, bless Muhammad and the family of Muhammad.

In every class, we request one of the students to begin the class with this Du'ā. Let us begin in alphabetical order. Sisters who are not comfortable should let the instructor know, in advance.

# As students of the Quran, let us do the following

- -Ability to read Quranic verses and sūrahs. It is a good habit to recite the Quran in the presence of others who are willing to help you improve your recitation.
- Always have a Quran with text and parallel translation. Any translation is fine, but we will use the translation by Ali Quli Qarai, which a Phrase-by-Phrase translation.
- Know how to locate a verse manually or by using Quran app within a few seconds.

# Love for learning the Quran

- -Instill love for the Holy Quran: listening to recitation, doing tilāwah, read on the science, history, translations, attending tafsīr sessions, etc.
- -Challenge yourselves in learning Quranic vocabulary; say, learn 5 words, then 7, then 10, then 14 words per day. You can continue to increase the number over time.
- -Did you know that about 45% of the Quran is made of less than 100 words?

#### وَلَقَدْ يَسَّرْنَا الْقُرْآنَ لِلذِّكْرِ فَهَلْ مِن مُّلَّكِرٍ We have made the Quran easy to remember . . .

This is verse Q 54:17. It repeats in verses 22, 32 & 40 of the same surah. The translation of the complete verse is:

And We have indeed made the Quran easy to understand and remember: then is there any that will receive admonition?

The word (لِلذِّكْرِ) has been rendered differently as follow:

For Remembrance — Arthur J Arberry

To understand and remember - Abdullah Yusuf Ali

To bear in mind – Muhammad Asad

To remember – Muhammad Marmaduke Pickthall

For the sake of admonishment – Ali Quli Qarai

#### Quran memorization by an English person

Bismillāh. Do you know how to get different translations online? Let us navigate together <u>www.tanzil.net</u>. You can use your phone, tablet or laptop.

Footnote to verse 54:17 by Marmaduke Pickthall: It is a fact that the Koran is marvelously easy for believers to commit to memory. Thousands of people in the East know the whole Book by heart. The translator, who finds great difficulty in remembering well-known English quotations accurately, can remember page after page of the Koran in Arabic with perfect accuracy.

# (الْضَّمَآئِرُ الْمُتَّصِلَةُ) Lesson 4 on attached pronouns

Quranic verses that contain multiple pronouns:

Q 2:7 Allah has set a seal on their hearts and their hearing, and there is a blindfold on their sight, and there is a great punishment for them.

Q 91:14 But they called <u>him</u> a liar and hamstrung <u>her</u>. So, <u>their</u> Lord crushed <u>them</u> for <u>their</u> sin, and leveled <u>it</u>

Note that all pronouns above have been **suffixed**, i.e., **attached** to the words or letters before them.

# My observations when marking the assignments

Alhamdu lillāh more than half of us submitted the homework

Māshā Allāh, many conjugated the nouns with pronouns in Arabic

Most of us conjugated correctly with minor errors.

It is good to see that within the third session you could conjugate the nouns Some of the mistakes:

- 1) A few joined the pronouns to letter 2 or wrote it very closely. The following 6 letters cannot be joined to the next letter in the noun, pronouns, verbs, etc.

- 2) Some of us missed including the harakat (vowel marks).
- 3) First person pronoun in dual & plural attached to رَبُّنَا is رَبُّنَا is رَبُّنَا in many Quranic Du'ās?

O Allah, disgrace the one who disgraces Islam, Muslims and the oppressed.

Read the above repeatedly, including in the Qunut of your mustahab prayers.

- 1. The pronoun à is attached to <u>particle</u> أ, and the pronoun à is attached <u>noun</u> رُبُّ is attached <u>noun</u>.
- 2. Both the above pronouns are masculine, singular and in third person
- 3. BONUS: open the Holy Quran and check the context of the phrase. In both cases the pronoun refers to Nabī Ibrāhīm عليت when Allah عليت asks him to submit (i.e., accept Islam) and Abraham said: أَسْلَمْتُ لِرَبِّ الْعَالَمِينَ I submit to the Lord of all the worlds. He was a Muslim like us and prayed the way we did.
