

ALI 666: Quranic Arabic, Level 1, Gession 1



Fridays, Sep 29 to Dec 1, 2023, at Masumeen Islamic Centre

Description: Quranic Arabic helps Muslims understand the language of the Quran. In this course, we will learn simple Quranic vocabulary and grammar. Students will need to put in an average of three hours a week to work on the course. In this semester, we will identify nouns and their different forms, a few verbs, and particles from the oft recited Quranic Sūras. We will us Qur'anic Language Made Easy by Hafiza Iffath Hasan as the main text. During the class, we will often refer to The Qur'an: With a Phrase-by-Phrase English Translation by Ali Quli Qarai Occasionally we may take passages from *Access to Qur'anic Arabic* by AbdulWahid Hamid.

What is the objective of the Course?

The Holy Quran as we all know was revealed in Arabic. Allah 'azza wajall (Mighty and Majestic) mentions this in several verses of the Quran. In 12:3, for example, He says: Indeed, we have revealed the Quran in Arabic so that you may understand. Additionally, the Quran is a book unlike any other. It is not like other books in style, approach, subject matter and the arrangement of its contents. A scholar who has translated the Quran comments: "This is a book of fiery oration, passionate discourses, heartfelt impact, tear flowing appeal, convincing reasoning, mesmerizing eloquence, exquisite literary style and charming prose. None of these adjectives are exaggerated." So let us try to understand the Divine message directly in Arabic without depending on translations.

What will we **not** cover in the Course?

Please note that we will **not** cover the following:

- 1) Quran *tilāwah* volunteers may be asked to recite passages from in the lessons. The instructor may point out to tajwid rules to ensure that we recite the Quran correctly.
- 2) Arabic writing —when the homework requires to answers in words, phrases, sentences and Quranic passages then you can cut and paste from www.tanzil.net
- 3)<u>conversational Arabic</u> in this course. Occasionally, we may borrow phrases from common Du'ās, Hadith and Arabic phrases to explain certain structure of Arabic style. So, in the name of Allah let us begin our journey.

Text, Unit 1, Lesson 1

Bismillāh. Grammatically, there are three types of words (الْكُلِمَاتُ): noun (بالنَّمُ), verb (فِعْلُ), particle (حَرْفُ). Note the author of the text renders harf as other than verb or noun. It may be because harf also means a letter such as alif, bā, tā, etc.

A **noun** (*ism*, *asmā*) is a name of an object, place, person, an action or an idea.

A **verb**: (fi'l, af'āl) is a word that indicates action by one or more persons (even jinn and animals) in the past, present or future tenses.

A **particle** (*harf, hurūf*) is any word other than a noun or a verb. So, the words 'to' (*ilā*), 'from' (*min*) are examples of particles (*hurūf*). Refer to the Text for examples.

Differentiating between the short and long vowels

Please note the use of diacritical marks over letters 'a,', 'i', and 'u', to indicate long vowels. As Muslims we take care of pronunciation when doing Quran tilāwah. Sometimes, missing the long vowels can change the meaning. For example:

36:46 There does not come to them any sign from among the signs of their Lord but that they have been disregarding it

7:23 They said, 'Our Lord, we have wronged ourselves! If You do not forgive us and have mercy upon us, we will surely be among the losers.'

Use color coding to differentiate between nouns, verbs and particles. <u>Hint</u>: you may refer to the translation of these surahs to guess if types of words.


As students of the Quran, let us do the following


- Ability to read Quranic verses and suras. It is a good habit to recite the Quran in the presence of others who are willing to help you improve your recitation.
- Always have a Quran with text and parallel translation. Any translation is fine, but we will use the translation by Ali Quli Qarai, which a phrase-by-phrase translation.
- Know how to locate a verse manually or by using Quran app in less than a minute.
- Instill love for the Holy Quran: listening, tilāwah, science, history, translations, attending tafsir sessions, etc.
- Challenge yourselves in learning Quranic words; say, learn 5 words, then 7, then 10, then 14 words per day. You can continue to increase the number over time.
- Partner with a colleague so the two of you help each other
- Develop fun for learning and understanding the Quran in which Allah (swt) talks to us directly.
