
# ALI 666: Quranic Arabic, Level 1, Session 2 (Oct 6, 2023)

#### Fridays Sep 29 to Dec 1, 2023, at Masumeen Islamic Centre

**Description**: Quranic Arabic helps Muslims understand the language of the Quran. In this course, we will learn simple Quranic vocabulary and grammar. Students will need to put in an average of three hours a week to work on the course. In this semester, we will identify nouns and their different forms, a few verbs, and particles from the oft recited Quranic Sūras. We will us Qur'anic Language Made Easy by Hafiza Iffath Hasan as the main text. During the class, we will often refer to The Qur'an: With a Phrase-by-Phrase English Translation by Ali Quli Qarai Occasionally we may take passages from *Access to Our'anic Arabic* by AbdulWahid Hamid.

#### Translation of the Du'ā before the class

In the name of Allah, the All-beneficent, the All-merciful. O Allah, bless Muhammad and the family of Muhammad. O Allah, grant us success in (thinking, saying and doing) that which You love and are pleased with. And never leave us to ourselves for the blink of an eye.

O Allah: remove from us the darkness of doubt (and error) and favor us with the light of understanding. O Allah: open for us the doors of Your mercy and unfold for us the treasures of Your knowledge. O Allah, bless Muhammad and the family of Muhammad.

## What is the **objective** of the Course?\_1

The Holy Quran as we all know was revealed in Arabic. Allah 'azza wajall (Mighty and Majestic) mentions this in several verses of the Quran. In verse 12:3, for example, He says:

Indeed, we have revealed the Quran in Arabic so that you may understand.

Additionally, the Quran is a book unlike any other. It is not like other books in style, approach, subject matter and the arrangement of its contents. A scholar who has translated the Quran comments:

## Getting the Divine Message from the Quran

"This is a book of fiery oration, passionate discourses, heartfelt impact, tear flowing appeal, convincing reasoning, mesmerizing eloquence, exquisite literary style and charming prose. None of these adjectives are exaggerated."

So, let us try to understand the Divine message directly in Arabic without depending on translations.

Let us learn Arabic through Quranic vocabulary, verses, phrases, sentences and style.

## The following will not be covered in the course


- 1) Quran tilāwah, all students are expected to be able to read verses, passages and surahs from the Quran for this course. InshāAllah, we plan to refer to the Quran often during the class session. Occasionally, the instructor may point to a few Tajwid rules to assist in the correct reading of the Quran.
- 2) Arabic writing, we do not plan to cover who to write Arabic alphabets or how to apply them in words. If a question requires answering words and phrases in Arabic, then you may copy and paste from tanzil.net or you use transliteration of those words and phrases.
- 3) conversational Arabic will not be covered.

NOTE: Occasionally, we may borrow phrases from common Du'ās, Hadith and Arabic phrases to explain certain structure of Arabic style.


### Three types of al-kalimāt in al-Qadr that are obvious

## As students of the Quran, let us do the following

- -Ability to read Quranic verses and sūrahs. It is a good habit to recite the Quran in the presence of others who are willing to help you improve your recitation.
- -Always have a Quran with text and parallel translation. Any translation is fine, but we will use the translation by Ali Quli Qarai, which a Phrase-by-Phrase translation.
- Know how to locate a verse manually or by using Quran app within a few seconds.

## Love for learning the Quran

- -Instill love for the Holy Quran: listening to recitation, doing tilāwah, read on the science, history, translations, attending tafsīr sessions, etc.
- -Challenge yourselves in learning Quranic vocabulary; say, learn 5 words, then 7, then 10, then 14 words per day. You can continue to increase the number over time.
- -Did you know that about 45% of the Quran is made of less than 100 words?

## Unit 1, Lesson 2 on pronouns (ٱلْضَّمَائِرُ)

Bismillāh. Read the Basic Points (on p 13) and study the table at the bottom. Do you have any questions about these?

The Holy Quran uses pronouns a lot. **A pronoun is a word used instead of noun**. Pronouns are divided into two forms: detached (or independent) and attached (or joined) pronouns. Now go through the Table on Detached Pronouns on p 14 of the Text. Know that as students of Quranic Arabic we **must memorize** this Table.

Quranic verses that contain multiple pronouns:

Q 2:7 Allah has set a seal on their hearts and their hearing, and there is a blindfold on their sight, and there is a great punishment for them.


Q 91:14 But they called <u>him</u> a liar and hamstrung <u>her</u>. So, <u>their</u> Lord crushed <u>them</u> for <u>their</u> sin, and leveled <u>it</u>


